

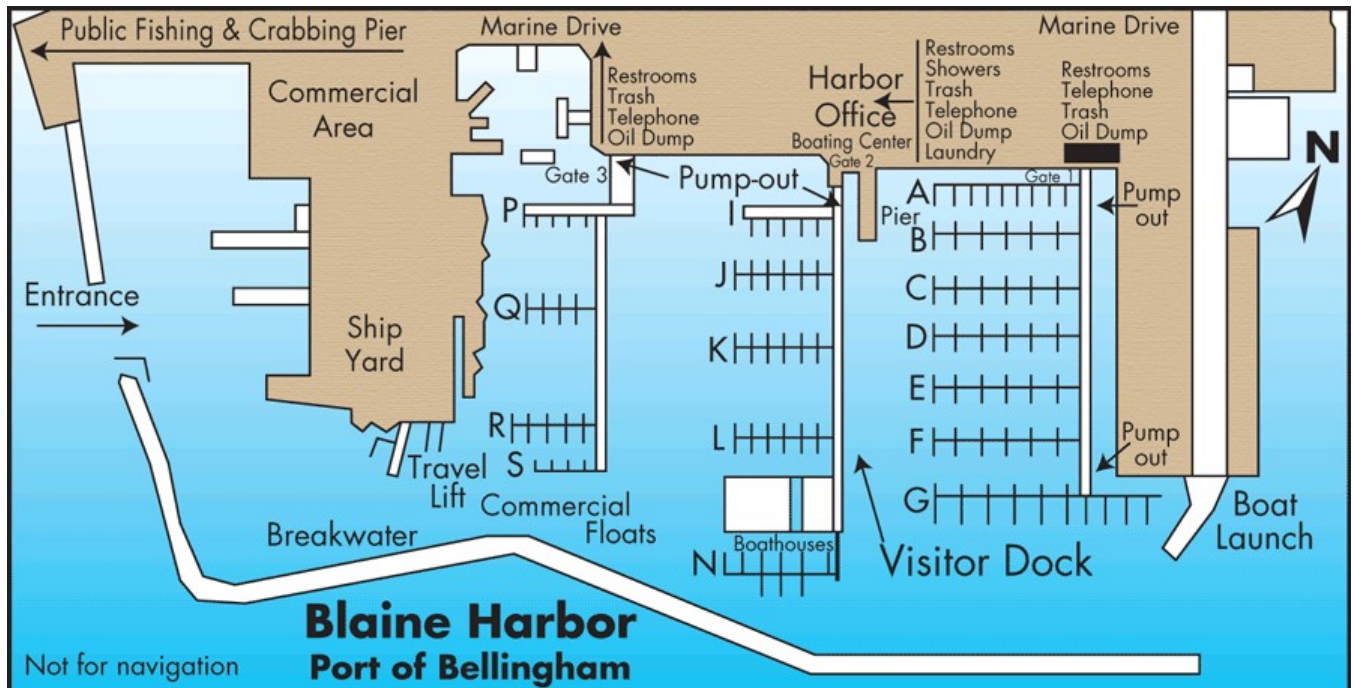
170602-18 – Sailing Trip with Mark & Serena Jackson

Fueled her up then took it out for a sail around the harbor. Pegasus is a 50 ft Hunter with center cockpit .



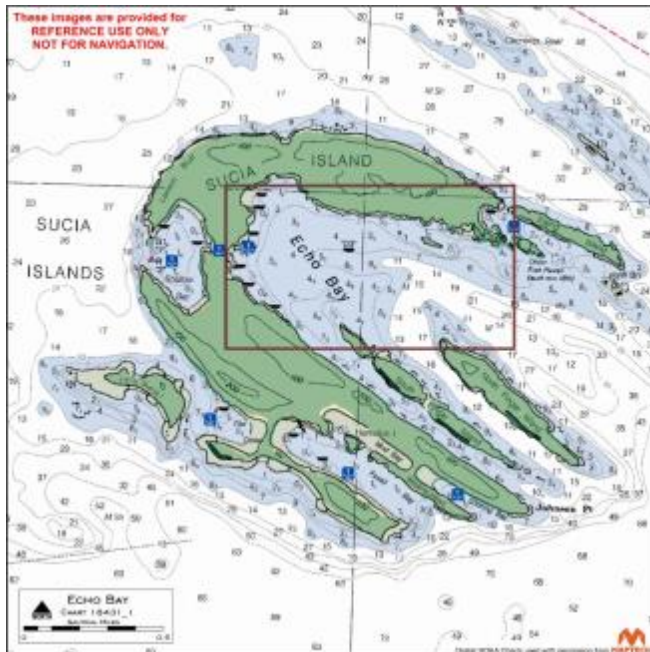


The objective of this trip was to take it out for a shakedown cruise around the San Juan Islands.

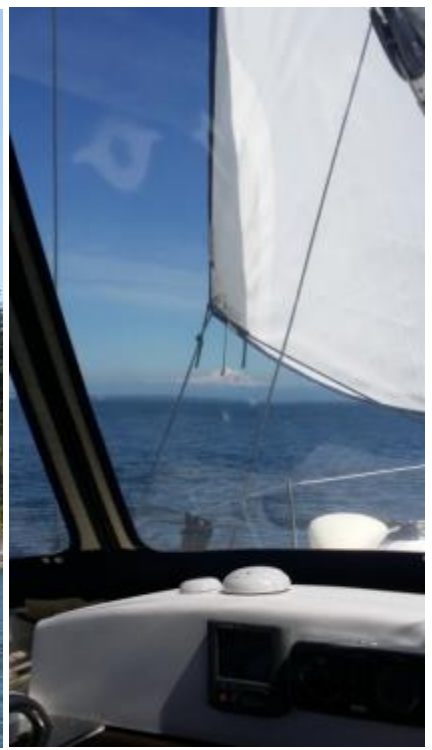




Our first stop would be Sucia Island. Engine over headed because it need coolant. Good thing we had it on board and they figured it out.

Walked around Fox bay.



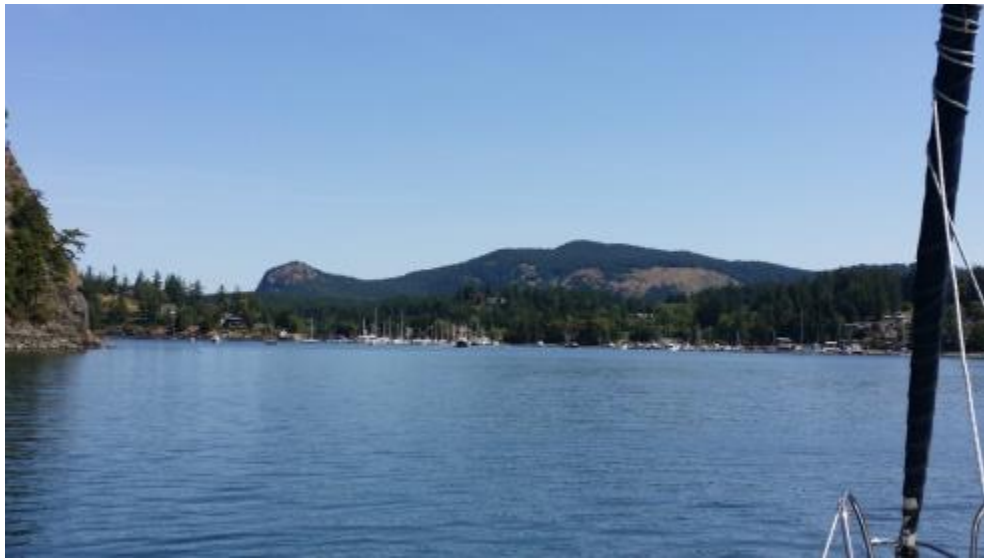

Heading to Deer Harbor on Orcas Island. It was a short trip from Sucia. We anchored.



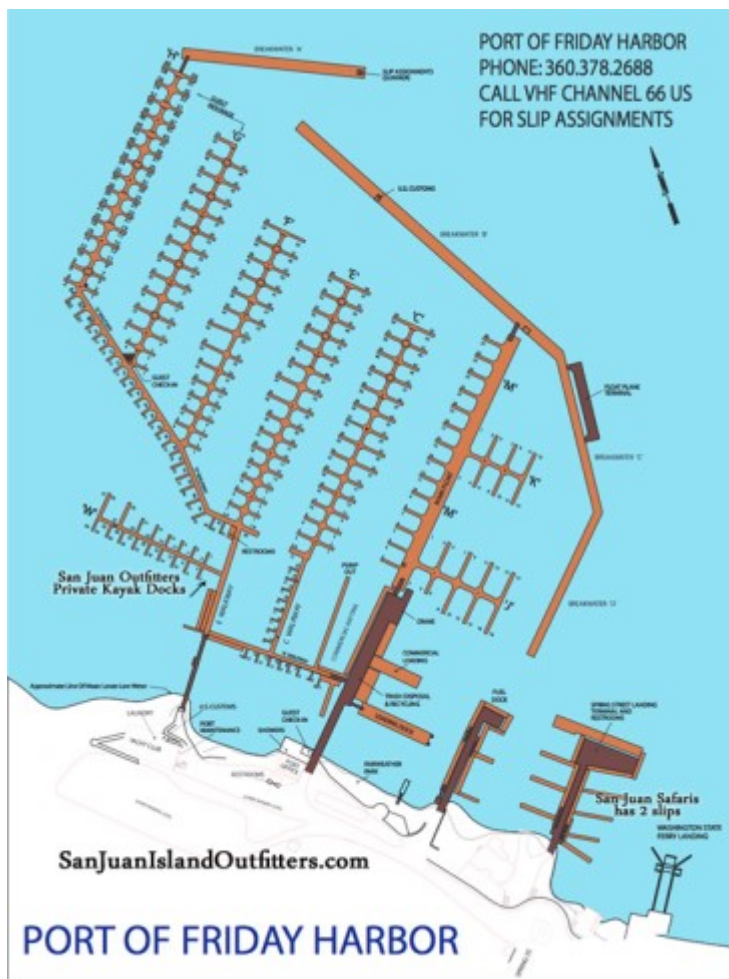
Going past Spiden Island.

Stayed overnight. Moorage was \$100.



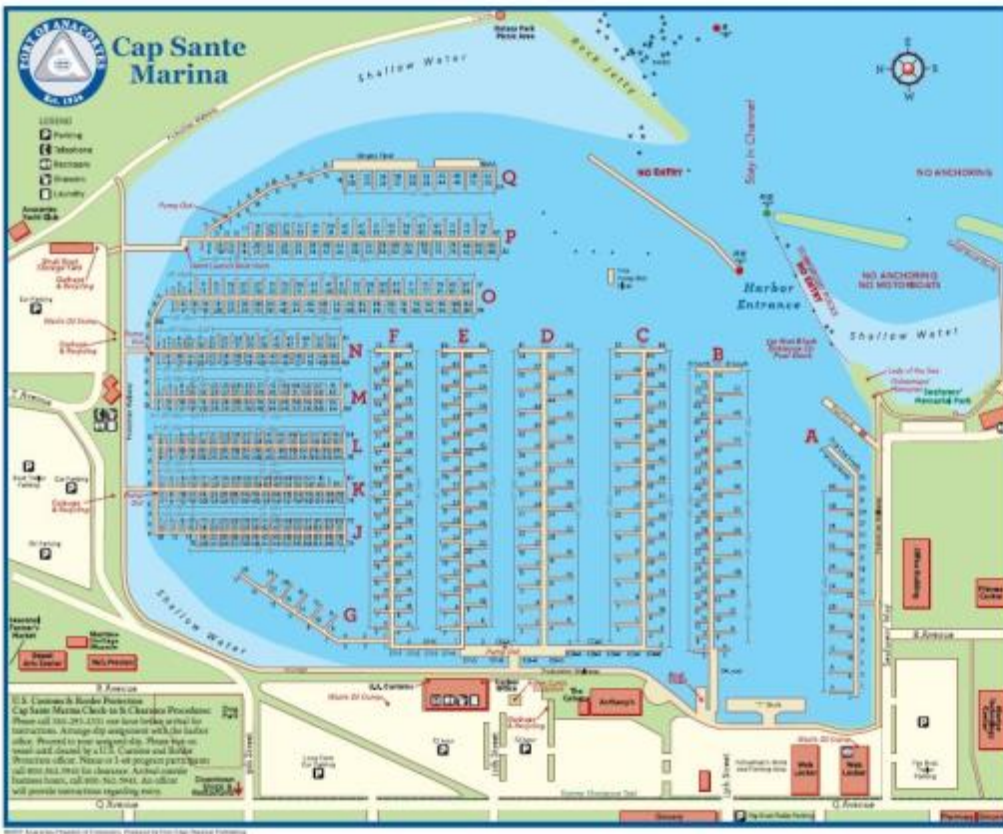


Stain Glass in the Moran Mansion

Monday, June 12

Headed back to Blaine to work on the boat. Had a few challenges getting back. Winds picked up and the autopilot over corrected and the main sail started flapping hard. Had to get the sail in before it tore.

At the marina, the winds were probably 25 knots and we couldn't get the boat into her slip. She banged into the boat houses a couple of times, but luckily we didn't sustain any damage. We stayed on the guest dock for the night and moved the boat to her slip in the morning.

We worked on the boat for the rest of the week and came home on Sunday June 18th.
