A recorded version, in E minor is on the Ten Strike album "Neuantics", available from the Kitchen Musician.

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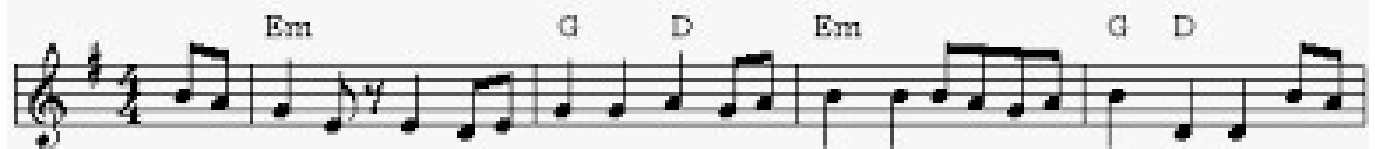
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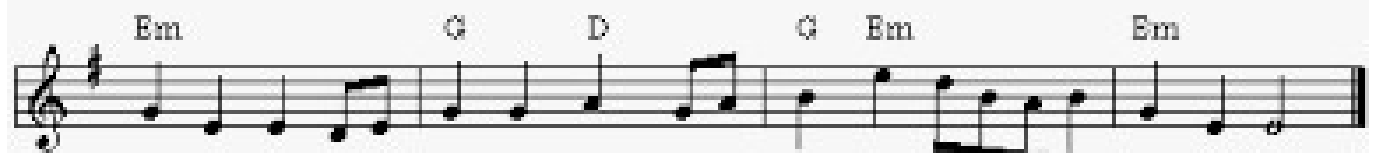
