Oklahomal was first musical writing venture for the legendary team of Rodgers and Hammerstein, and their play marked the first time a musical started with an a cappella song.

The original Broadway production opened on March 31, 1943 and was a box-office smash that ran for an unprecedented 2,212 performances. Oklahomal later enjoyed awardwinning revivals, national tours, foreign productions and an Academy Award-winning 1955 film adaptation starring Gordon MacRae, Shirley Jones and Rod Steiger.
